

RAJASTHAN ENGINEERING ADMISSION PROCESS (CAM)-2019

FAO (Frequently Ask Questions)

1.	<p>Who is eligible for CAM2019? Candidates seeking admission for M.Tech./M.Arch. programme must ensure following minimum qualification:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. A candidate must hold B.E./B.Tech. degree in appropriate discipline mentioned in Table-1 from RTU or any other recognized University/Institution or any other examinations recognized as equivalent thereto by competent authority.2. Candidate must have minimum 55% (6.25 CGPA on 10 points scale and equivalent) marks in the qualifying degree examination (50% or 5.75 CGPA on 10 points scale of relaxation is admissible for SC/ST candidates). If a recognized university has an approved conversion formula of CGPA into percentage then it will be applicable on producing the certificate of conversion from the concerned University. Otherwise AICTE approved conversion formula will be used i.e. Equivalent CGPA = Percentage/10 + 0.75.3. Candidates having B.Arch. degree and seeking admission to M. Arch/M. Plan programmes should possess 50% (5.75 CGPA on 10 points scale and equivalent) and 45% (5.25 CGPA on 10 points scale and equivalent) in case of SC/ST, as per requirement of COA.4. Candidates with qualifications obtained through examinations conducted by professional societies recognized by MHRD/UGC/AIU/UPSC/AICTE {e.g. AMIE by Institute of Engineers (India); AMICE by Institute of Civil Engineers (India); IEE} as equivalent to B.E./B.TECH.5. Candidates having M.Sc./MCA seeking admission to certain M.Tech. programmes should possess valid and qualified GATE score of the relevant branch. The equivalency of any degree for admission to any programme will be decided by University.6. The eligibility criteria given in the following table are minimum and mere possessing the same does not qualify the eligibility for admissions. University may prescribe any other requirements over and above these conditions.
2.	<p>If a candidate is appearing in supplementary exam of qualifying examination, is he / she allowed to apply for CAM-2019?</p> <p>Not allowed, one should have minimum qualification on or before last date of filling the application form.</p>
3.	<p>What are modes of filling up the application form of CAM2019?</p> <p>There is only one mode “Online Mode” for filling up the application form of CAM-2019 at website http://www.rtu.ac.in/RTU/cam2019</p>

4.	<p>Do I require any document to get registered online?</p> <p>Yes, Initially you have to fill the information in the online application as required and also upload the scanned copy of four documents as class 10th and B.Tech/B.E. marksheet, certificate of reserved category, valid GATE score card.</p>
5.	<p>Are there any restrictions on the file size for the photograph and signature?</p> <p>Yes, the file size of the photograph image in jpg format is up to 100 KB and the signature image in jpg format is up to 50 KB.</p>
6.	<p>How many colleges are available for admission through CAM2019?</p> <p>All government colleges of Rajasthan state and private colleges affiliated to Rajasthan Technical University, Kota and Bikaner Technical University, Bikaner are available through CAM 2019. For complete seat matrix visit website: http://www.rtu.ac.in/RTU/cam2019</p>

7.	<p>Is Aadhar number mandatory to fill the application form?</p> <p>No, it is not mandatory to fill the application form if you do not possess an Aadhar card number, you will be required to enroll for it first and then submit the Aadhar Acknowledgement Receipt Number.</p>
8.	<p>I am from Assam / Meghalaya / Jammu and Kashmir and the Government has not issued Aadhar Card in our state yet. What can I do?</p> <p>Candidates from these states can apply for CAM-2019 by submitting details of Passport/Voter ID Card/ Ration Card / other ID card issued by the Government.</p>
9.	<p>I belong to outside Rajasthan, how can I apply for admission?</p> <p>The candidates from outside Rajasthan may apply through counseling conducted by CAM-2019.</p>
10.	<p>How can I pay the fee for the CAM-2019 Registration?</p> <p>You can pay the fee by online mode through Billdesk gateway facility with addition of credit card/debit card/net banking/other online payment gateway charges, as applicable.</p>
11.	<p>What is the registration fee for CAM2019?</p> <p>A candidate is required to pay the registration fee of CAM-2019, which is Rs. 3000/- (Rs. 1500/- for SC/ST category) and can be submitted online.</p>
12.	<p>What should a candidate do in case of a failed transaction while paying the fee?</p> <p>In case, the payment status remains as “Failed” during the online transaction of the application fee, the candidates should note that the fee payment is not complete. In such instances, candidates will be required to pay the fees again via online transaction and download the acknowledgment slip. If the amount is found debited against the previous attempt, the same will be processed at payment gateway and refunded back within 7 to 10 working days.</p>

13.	<p>Can I write the CGPA in place of percentage?</p> <p>No, entry of CGPA/CGPI is not allowed. Candidate has to convert CGPA to percentage marks (%) by CGPA conversion formula and candidates belonging outside Rajasthan will have to convert CGPA/CGPI to percentage marks by using CBSE/AICTE formula.</p>
14.	<p>How many choices can a candidate give?</p> <p>A candidate can submit as many numbers of choices as he/she wishes in order of preference from the list of available choices.</p>
15.	<p>If I have made mistakes in my application form, can I fill another one or correct the mistakes in the application form?</p> <p>Candidates can submit only one application. The correction is possible only before final submission of the application form.</p>
16.	<p>What, if I forget my CAM-2019 application no. / Password?</p> <p>The candidates should always remember his application no. and date of birth. Although the password can be reset by clicking “forget password”.</p>
17.	<p>Whom should I contact for any further assistance and queries?</p> <p>Contact at CAM-2019 helpline Number: 9784720191, 0744-2473845. You can also write an email to rtucam2019@rtu.ac.in.</p>
18.	<p>What happens if I do not “Lock” my choices?</p> <p>If the candidate does not lock his/her choices, the last saved choices/preferences will be locked automatically at 12-00 night of last date of filling the application form.</p>
19.	<p>I do not want to accept the allocated seat. What should I do?</p> <p>The allocated seat can be rejected by not reporting at the allotted institute but you will be out of counseling process and would have to apply again as a fresh candidate in III round.</p>
20.	<p>What is seat allotment procedure?</p> <p>The seat allotment is divided into various rounds as per the requirement and convenience of the candidates into various M. Tech./M.Arch. programmes. Seat shall be allotted based on valid GATE score (first preference) and choice filled by you. The second preference shall be given to those candidates who have no valid GATE score by percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and choices filled.</p>
21.	<p>I have been offered a seat in the any round of allotment as per the options exercised by me. If I do not opt the seat at this moment. Can I accept the same seat later?</p> <p>No, if you do not report in person and do not accept the seat in the respective seat as per the schedule period (please follow the schedule), then you will lose the seat and you will be out of seat allotment process in CAM-2019 such candidates can participate in special round.</p>

What are different rounds of seat allotment?

First round:

- 22.
- i. In this round, seats will be allotted to all registered candidates on the basis of their choices and merit list criteria.
 - ii. All allotted candidates are required to report physically to the allotted institute for document verification and college fee submission, only if he/she is not interested to upgrade/participate in the second round. A candidate who wish to apply for upward movement, need not to report physically at the allotted institute.
 - iii. A candidate who has neither reported to the allotted institute as per the schedule nor applied for upward movement (second round), his/her allotment will be canceled. However, He/she may register again as a new candidate in the third round with payment of registration fees.
 - iv. If a candidate wishes to surrender his/her occupied seat, he/she needs to submit the seat surrender form which is available on the CAM website and also required to submit his/her consent online on the link (**seat surrender option**) on CAM 2019 website. After completing the seat surrender formalities, his/her registration will be canceled.
 - v. If a candidate fails to produce a valid GATE score and eligibility, his/her allotment and candidature will be canceled and he/she will not be allowed to occupy any seat. However, with valid eligibility, he/she may register as a new candidate in third round.
 - vi. If a candidate has not been allotted any seat due to exhaust of choices, he/she will be considered automatically for second round of upward movement.

Second round:

- i. This is an upward movement round, where a candidate is essentially required to submit his/her consent **ONLINE** for upward movement against the allotted seat in the first round. In that case, the candidate is not required to report physically to the allotted institute in the first round.
- ii. After his/her consent for the upward movement, his/her earlier allotted seat would be available for allotment to subsequent candidates only if, a candidate has got his/her higher preference, otherwise his/her seat will remain same.
- iii. **After the allotment, the candidates are required to report physically to the allotted institute for document verification and college fee submission.**
- iv. A candidate who has not reported to the allotted institute as per the schedule, his/her allotment will be canceled. However, He/she may register again as a new candidate in the third round with payment of registration fees.
- v. The point no. iv-vi of First round will be applicable for surrender/withdrawal, non fulfillment of eligibility criteria and un-allotted conditions in this round also.
- vi. If a candidate has not been allotted any seat in the second round, then he/she may be considered for the third round where he/she can modify and relock their choices without payment of registration fees.

Third round:

	<p>i. In this round, registration will be open for new candidates. They can fill their choices and lock it as per the seat matrix (available online) based on the vacant <u>seats after first and second rounds.</u></p> <p>ii. Registration fees for new candidates is Rs 3000/- (Rs 1500/- for SC/ST candidates).</p> <p>iii. Already registered candidates who have not been allotted any seat in first and second round due to exhaust of choices, they shall be permitted without payment of registration fee to revise their choices and relock it on or before the last date.</p> <p>iv. Reported candidate in the first and second round will not be allowed to participate in third and subsequent rounds.</p> <p>v. The point no. iv-vi of First round will be applicable for surrender/withdrawal, non fulfillment of eligibility criteria and un-allotted conditions in this round also. If a candidate has not been allotted any seat due to exhaust of choices, he/she will be considered automatically for fourth round of upward movement.</p> <p>Fourth round:</p> <p>i. This is an upward movement round, where a candidate is essentially required to submit his/her consent ONLINE for upward movement against the allotted seat in the third round. In that case, the candidate is not required to report physically to the allotted institute in the third round.</p> <p>ii. After his/her consent, earlier allotted seat would be available for allotment to subsequent candidates only if, a candidate has got his/her higher preference, otherwise his/her seat will remain same.</p> <p>iii. After the allotment, the candidates are required to report physically to the allotted institute for document verification and college fee submission.</p> <p>iv. The point no. iv-vi of First round will be applicable for surrender/withdrawal, non fulfillment of eligibility criteria and un-allotted conditions in this round also.</p>
23.	<p>What is special round?</p> <p>Fifth round as a special round (if required):</p> <p>i. This is the special round in which if any seat remains vacant then the special round may be held.</p> <p>ii. The seat matrix will be displayed on website against the vacant seats.</p> <p>iii. Any interested candidate may register for this round by paying Rs. 3000/- (Rs. 1500/- for SC/ST) as registration fee and Rs. 10,000/- as a commitment fee.</p> <p>iv. All allotted candidates are required to report physically to the allotted institute for document verification and college fee submission, where the commitment fee (Rs. 10,000/-) will be adjusted as a part of their college fees.</p> <p>v. The application and commitment fee will not be refunded back, in case the candidate does not report to the allotted Institute.</p> <p>vi. Already registered candidates of the third round, who have not allotted any seat due to exhaust of choices, shall be permitted to revise their choices without paying the</p>

	<p>registration fee. However the commitment fee will be payable.</p> <p>Detailed information about Special round of CAM2019 can be seen in information brochure and also at www.rtu.ac.in/RTU/cam2019.</p>
24.	<p>I have my caste certificate case pending. Can I apply and produce the certificate as and when I get it?</p> <p>No, the candidate should have his caste certificate at the time of filling the application form, since it has to be uploaded during filling the application form.</p>
